In August of 2009, he was placed on the heart transplant list and received a new heart on Halloween. During Luke's first 16 months, he and his family lived almost exclusively in a hospital. co-workers, family and friends - best known as





In June of 2019, we purchased and financed a townhouse in Durham that will allow families a "home away from home" while their child is being treated at Duke Medical Center. The House of Hearts and Hope, located only 5 short


miles from the hospital, will be similar to the Ronald McDonald houses. However, ours will be unique because while the Ronald McDonald houses are shared by multiple families, ours will be a home to only one family at a time. After a transplant or during cancer treatments, patients have to be isolated and extremely careful to avoid germs and sickness typically caused by contact with people. The House of Hearts and Hope will be a safe, germ-free, private residence for these children and their families to use while they are away from their home.

Luke Sigmon's mother, Lyndsi, said one of her

"fondest memories was when our family was able to celebrate Christmas away from the hospital. We were able to forget, just for a brief moment, about having a child with a special heart. We were just like any other family celebrating Christmas."



Rita Lail, one of our board members whose son Trevor lost his battle with lymphoma said: "The best thing about having a place to stay (like the house), was the sense of normalcy that it provided during a time that was anything but normal. It was great to have a place to call home after a long day at the hospital. I was thankful to be able to do simple things



like cook dinner or even make a bed. My hope is that the House of Hearts and Hope will be a refuge for families going through some of the toughest days in their lives. I want it to be a place that keeps families together. A place where they feel "whole" again instead of being separated."
